# Tom Howard, Artist Statement, September 2023

I've been pursuing this thing called ART for over four decades now. If there's one thing I've learned, it's that I feel only as successful, or not, as the most recent painting I've completed. Which makes for a bit of a roller coaster ride through my daily travail in life. It is said that your worst day painting is better than your best day in the office. What do you think?

I love to draw. Whether it be with paint or graphite, it's all drawing for me. Sometimes 1 try to ride that edge between representation (realism) and abstraction. But isn't any painting an abstraction anyway? I mean, after all, no painting is ever the real thing. Consequently it's automatically an abstraction of the real thing. I guess that leaves only the viewer's evaluation of just how successful the artist was in their depiction of the form.

Some of my paintings in this exhibit were completed "en plein air." Consequently, there were times when drawing did give way to expression of color, form, and gesture. Being in the moment, there in nature...well, there's no replacement for it. One thing that a painting can't do is communicate smell. Yet smell is the facilitator of one of my most memorable experiences, while plein air painting. It had just rained, and with everything being still wet on that Fall afternoon, the aromas were incredible. There's a word for it. They call it "Petrichor", the smell of rain. Even though my plein air study was a disaster, I was more than inspired. I even felt driven to complete the watercolor, "Hickman Canyon," in the studio, as a preservation of that experience.

Plein air studies work in the service of studio paintings. There is all too often something lost in translation when the artist tries to rely on photography only to make a painting. Cameras are not well adapted to recording the darks and the lights well in the same photograph. Often there is much more light and color in the shadows than one may know. Being there in person can help with that visual challenge, and show the artist what they might otherwise miss.

I paint for relaxation, yet 1 seek to be a professional. 1 paint for praise, yet I like to be alone when 1 work. 1 like to capture a likeness of my subject, yet 1 enjoy the abstract qualities of a painting when they occur. Four decades of painting, some dangerous moments, and some bouts with health have hopefully knocked a few chips off of my hard block of stubbornness and foolishness, and have made me a more fitting and humble specimen for the future. Painting will go on, and the end will come, hopefully with a brush in my hand.
